Founded by a group of professional actors in 2006 as the Heartland Actors' Repertory Theatre, HART rebranded in 2016 to the Indianapolis Shakespeare Company when creating free outdoor Shakespeare became our primary focus. Thank you to the artists, board members, staff, volunteers, and audiences who have supported us all of these years. We have come this far because of the dedication of so many who believe that high quality theatre should be accessible to everyone, that artists should be paid for their work, and that Shakespeare is a fabulous vehicle for exploring what is meaningful in our lives today.

We are launching into a new era where we are seeking to redefine the intersection of professional theatre and community. We want to have a year-round presence and are planning to build Shakes House on our property at 2717 Rader Street. The vision is a center providing creative opportunities for neighborhood children and adults in all areas of theatre onstage and behind the scenes and also offering affordable housing and employment opportunities for the neighborhood. Our 2022 Hip Hop Shakespeare project, led by artists of color and a finalist for the prestigious Impact 100 grant, will bring together Indy's finest hip hop and rap artists with Shakespeare artists to create a new, exciting art form that honors both disciplines. This fall, our Traveling Troupe COMEDY OF ERRORS will share the joy of live theatre with students across Indy. Finally, our Indy Shakes Gala on Sept. 23rd at the brand-new Guaaman Haus Brewery Festhall here in the Riverside neighborhood will feature NNW cuisine and loads of fun!



Synopsis

Welcome to our play! Plan to be bewitched, bothered and bewildered by magic, practical jokers and trickery. At court, parents and rulers dictate who marries whom, and punish girls who disobey. In the nearby forest, fairies and magic decree who falls in love with whom. The ordinary working people, out for a good time, get caught up in spells and trickery. As always, true love triumphs.

Theseus, Duke of Athens conquered Hippolyta, the Amazon warrior queen in battle, and wants to marry her. Proud Hippolyta has other ideas, but not many options. As Theseus woos, he is interrupted by Egeus, an ambitious mother with a rebellious daughter, Hermia. Egeus tells the Duke to order Hermia to marry the eligible Demetrius. Hermia is madly in love with Lysander. The Duke gives Hermia 3 days to decide. She can marry her mother's choice; become a nun; or be executed. What's a girl to do?

In desperation, Hermia and Lysander plan to elope, and flee to the forest. They share their plans with their friend, Helena. Helena has loved Demetrius for a long time. Thinking that the elopement will free Demetrius to marry her, she tells Demetrius of the elopement plan.

Now, we meet Bottom, the weaver, and her friends. These folks love to act. They are creating a play to celebrate the wedding of Theseus and Hippolyta, and will rehearse in the nearby forest. They are unaware of the fairy trickery that goes on each night in the forest


The rulers of the fairy world in the forest, King Oberon and Queen Titania, have had a huge argument. Oberon is so angry, that he decides to trick Titania. He asks his mischievous servant, Puck, to bring flowers to make a magic love potion. Oberon will pour this potion on Titania's eyelids when she is asleep. When she wakes, she will fall in love with the first being she sees.


As Oberon plots, Helena enters the forest following Demetrius. He is searching for Hermia, his promised bride. Oberon is moved by Helena's distress is over her lost lover. Oberon orders Puck to charm Demetrius's eyes with the love potion. Lysander and Hermia arrive on the scene. Puck mistakenly charms Lysander's eyes. Lysander falls madly in love with Helena when he wakes. Lysander abandons his true love, Hermia, who was sleeping with him, to pursue a bewildered Helena.

Meanwhile, Oberon is charming Titania's eyes. Nearby, Bottom and his friends are rehearsing their play. Puck, always ready for a laugh, overhears the group. With a spell, Puck transforms Bottom's head into the head of a donkey. The other players run away, terrified. Bottom sings to fight her fear of being abandoned in the forest. Her loud "singing" wakes Titania. Under the spell of the love potion, Titania falls in love with Bottom

The time has come to deal with the magical mayhem in the forest. Oberon discovers that Puck magicked Lysander's eyes in error. Oberon magics Demetrius' eyes, so he sees Helena as he wakes. When Demetrius discovers Lysander is wooing Helena, the two former friends quarrel fiercely. Hermia now arrives. Misunderstanding each other, the four lovers are in hell. To stop the conflict, the fairies cast a spell. The four lovers wander the forest until they fall asleep, exhausted. Then, under Oberon's supervision, Puck puts the love potion on Lysander's eyes. Now, Lysander loves Hermia; Demetrius loves Helena; and the girls get the guys they want. Oberon regrets his trickery as he watches Titania pursue a bewildered Bottom. He lifts his spell and reconciles with his Queen.

Walking happily in the forest before their wedding, Theseus and Hippolyta discover the four lovers. Theseus approves the marriages of Helena to Demetrius and of Hermia to Lysander. The three couples share their wedding party. As they celebrate, Bottom and her players present the "comic" tragedy of Pyramus and Thisbe. The fairies bless the newlywed and return to their forest. All is well.

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Key Characters

OBERON

Queen of the fairies and at odds with partner Titania, because she refuses to give a young Indian prince as a Knight for Oberon.

DEMETRIUS

Young man of Athens who initially was in love with Hermia but ultimately loves Helena.

LYSANDER

Young man of Athens in love with Hermia, but cannot marry her openly because her frather wishes her wed to Demetrius

EGEUS

Hermia's father who wants her to marry Demetrius and not Lysander.

PHILOSTRATE

Responsible for organizing the entertainment for Theseus's wedding celebration.

PEASEBLOSSOM, COBWEB, MOTH, AND MUSTARDSEED

Four fairies ordered by Titania to take care of Bottom once she falls in love with him.

TITANIA

Queen of the fairies, who refuses her partner, Oberon, the Knight she has been given.

THESEUS

The Duchess of Athens, engaged to Hippolyta.

HERMIA

Young woman of Athens in love with Lysander, childhood friend of Helena, and Egeus's daughter.

HELENA

Young woman of Athens in love with Demetrius, childhood friend of Hermia.

SNUG

The joiner who plays the lion in the celebration play.

SNOUT

Tom Snout, the tinker, who will play the wall in the celebration play.

PUCK

Robin Goodfellow, a mischievious fairy who plays pranks and serves as Oberon's jester.

HIPPOLYTA

The Queen of the Amazons, engaged to marry Theseus.

BOTTOM

Nick Bottom, a weaver who is a player in Theseus's marriage celebration play. Transformed temporarily into an ass by Puck.

QUINCE

Peter Quince, a carpenter and the leader of the player's who will put on the play for Theseus.

FLUTE

The bellows-mender who will play Thisbe, a young girl in love, in the marriage celebration play.

STARVELING

Robin Starveling, a tailor who will play the part of moonshine in the marriage celebration play.

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Director's Motes

Welcome back to the theatre! This production feels like a homecoming for me for so many reasons—home to Indianapolis, home to this community of artists, and of course, back home to the theatre after a very long year away. And what a theatre we're coming home to! It is a true honor to be making art here in this beautiful and powerful space. As we thought of what play would best celebrate the opening of the Taggart Memorial Amphitheatre, A Midsummer Night's Dream was the clear choice. Full of love and magic and silliness and exquisite poetry, it really is a celebration in itself, and I hope it feels that way to you. You may notice some of the choices and small changes we've made to bring this story to you in a way that begins to examine some qualities that are not worth celebrating in this play—or really any play that is over 400 years old. There are a number of things contained in this text that we now understand to be harmful or perpetuate stereotypes, so we have worked hard to make choices that create a world of Midsummer where all kinds of humans (and fairies!) will feel at home. Of course, the real miracle of Shakespeare is that it is chock full of beauty and truth about the human experience—all humans' experience. The universality and immediate relevance of this writing always takes my breath away, and it's my sincerest wish that everyone gets to have that revelation, no matter who they are.

Something about this play that really comes forward for me when I read it today is how different the Athenians are at the beginning of the play versus the end. Especially given what we have all been through in the last year—perhaps we collectively understand more than we ever have what it means to have an experience that changes our worldview forever. As the play progresses, the rigid nature of Athens gives way to the free impulses of Fairy World in the woods. By the end of the play, the lessons of the

woods have begun to influence the unyielding rules of Athens. Theseus and Hippolyta have evolved their understanding of each other. Theseus makes the choice to change the rules so that the young lovers can marry who they like. We go on a journey together and come full circle a little wiser and a lot more compassionate. That is my hope every time we go to the theatre together, and that is my hope for us tonight as we gather again as a community after a very hard year. Let us celebrate that we have come through these particular woods, at least for now, and revel together in what beauty and magic we can find on the other side.

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








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Who was Thomas Taggart?

a brief biography by James P. Fadely

Thomas Taggart was a prominent political and business figure of the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries in Indianapolis and across the state of Indiana. Born on November 17, 1856, in the village of Amyvale in County Monaghan, Ireland, Taggart was five years old when his family immigrated to the United States in 1861. They moved to Xenia, Ohio, where he left school at age fifteen and went to work in the local railroad depot restaurant. Sensing he had talent and was a hard worker, the company transferred him at age eighteen to the depot restaurant in Garrett, Indiana, north of Ft. Wayne. He became a U.S. citizen and then was sent to manage the dining hall at Indianapolis' Union Depot (predecessor to Union Station) when he was twenty-one. He married Eva

D. Bryant, with whom he had six children. Taggart, with an ever-present smile, was a charismatic personality who could talk to anyone about anything. He was now in the center of the city and state political scene. Indianapolis Democrats, long out of power after the Civil War, convinced him to run for Marion County auditor, a lucrative position in those days, and he won and served in that role from 1886-1894. With a knack for organization, he was named Marion County Democratic chairman in 1888 and carried the county for Democrat Grover



Cleveland against hometown favorite Benjamin Harrison. Elected state Democratic chairman in 1890, he carried Indiana for Cleveland over Harrison in the latter's re-election bid in 1892. This put Taggart on the national political map.

Taggart went on to be elected mayor of Indianapolis in 1895, 1897, and 1899. His major achievement as mayor was the purchase of 953 acres of land along the White River, an area the size of Central Park in New York City, for park land. He created the parks department and thus deserves the moniker "Father of Indianapolis Parks." He served as the Indiana representative on the Democratic National Committee from 1900 to 1916 and rose to chairman of the DNC 1904-08. He became an influential player in national Democratic politics, especially given that Indiana was a swing state with fifteen electoral votes.

In business, Taggart had owned a couple of hotels in downtown Indianapolis, but in 1901, as he was wrapping up his last term as mayor, he purchased the French Lick Springs Hotel in Orange County in southern Indiana. He transformed the hotel into an internationally known spa and resort. The Taggart family would own the hotel until 1946.

Taggart was appointed to a **United States** Senate seat in 1916 upon the death of Senator Benjamin Shively, serving for eight months before losing the election in the fall that year to retain the seat. He did not retire




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his business and political affairs. The state party persuaded him to run for the Senate seat again in 1920, but he lost in that year's Republican landslide.


The Taggarts lived at 1331 North Delaware Street in the Old Northside of Indianapolis, the penthouse apartment of the French Lick Springs Hotel, and their summer estate in Hyannis Port, Massachusetts, on Cape Cod, where their nextdoor neighbors were Joe and Rose Kennedy and children.

Taggart died on March 6, 1929, and is buried in Crown Hill Cemetery. Two years later, in 1931, the city and friends built this neoclassical colonnade memorial on the site of his signature achievement as mayor and named the park Thomas Taggart Riverside Park. Taggart's bipartisanship was echoed in the words of Republican Governor Harry G. Leslie, who stated at the memorial's dedication, "We can hope that this arch will inspire your children and mine to emulate the beautiful deeds that made Mr. Taggart famous."

He currently serves on the board of trustees of Hanover College. He and his family live in Indianapolis.

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
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
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
