

#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**



Love's Labor's Lost is the play that pops out if A Midsummer Night's Dream and Much Ado About Nothing had a baby. With the rapid-fire wordplay of the former and the battle-of-wits of the latter, LLL strikes a lovely, summery, easy chord that goes perfectly with a picnic covered in string lights and warm winds. Set at the Navarre Institute, a coastal retreat centering on wellness and New Age pursuit of the higher self, the King and his BFFs are determined to be peak cultural dudes; what unfolds is an exploration of vulnerability, enlightenment, and joy. This play is chock full of pleasure: in camaraderie, in love letters, in a good stretch and a cold beer. Don't search too hard for high stakes in the play; you'll come up short. No one is home from a distant war, there are no shipwrecks, and—I'm sorry to say—no one is a long lost twin. Instead, the people of Navarre grapple with everyday questions of being human.


What if I'm wrong?

How can I let go?



Yes, LLL is unapologetically silly and light. But in an age of doom-scrolling, overstimulation, and daunting headlines, I argue that there's nothing wrong with doubling down on joy. I invite you to lean into the ease of the evening. The lights are twinkling, the blanket is spread. Let's share some simple space. Thank you for joining us. Cheers!







#### **PLOT SUMMARY**

The play tells the story of King Ferdinand and his three friends, Berowne, Dumaine, and Longaville, who vow to stay away from women for three years to study. In this production the studying takes place at the Navarre Institute: a place that offers classes in meditation, yoga and all things Zen. The King's decree against women applies to the entire kingdom. When a local guy, Costard, is caught pursuing Jacquenetta, he is arrested. Don Armado, the one in charge of punishing Costard, is also in love with Jacquenetta. He writes her a letter for Costard to deliver.

Soon after the oath, the Princess of France and her three closest friends, Rosaline, Katharine, and Maria, arrive on state business. Due to the new laws put in place through the King's pledge, the women are kept outside the court. With the aid of the Princess's smart aleck assistant, Boyet, they are allowed to speak with Navarre and his friends. They soon realize that they have all met before. The King falls in love with the Princess, and each of his friends with one of her friends. Berowne writes a love letter to Rosaline, giving it to Costard to deliver. But Costard confuses the 2 letters and gives Berowne's letter to Jaquenetta, who gives it to the King.

Meanwhile, the yoga teacher Holofernes, the arts teacher Nathaniel, and Don Armado, plan to entertain the royals with a pageant (entitled the 'Nine Worthies'). It will feature the teachers, Costard, Armado, and his page, Moth.

The King and his friends watch each other in hiding as they separately declare their love for the women. They soon find out about everyone's feelings for the women. After his letter is revealed, Berowne convinces the men that love is a lawful part of their studies. The men decide to continue to entertain their guests.

#### PLOT SUMMARY CONT.

The men try to woo the women with gifts and visit them in disguise. Finally, the women trick them through disguises of their own. After all the pranks it is clear that the men and women are in love: King Ferdinand and the Princess, Berowne and Rosaline, Dumaine and Katharine, Longaville and Maria.

The men and women come together happily to watch the pageant of the 'Nine Worthies'. During the performance, Boyet gets a text saying that the King of France is dead. Because of this news, the Princess decides that she must return home. She declares a year-long period of mourning. This means a year of absence between the men of Navarre and the women of France. If, at the end of that time, the men keep their promises, the ladies may return to accept them in marriage. The play ends as the ladies leave, and Moth sings.


Missouri Repertory, Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park, and Syracuse Stage.
